#### **PURPOSE**

To advise families of our voluntary financial contributions, classroom curriculum contributions, specialist curriculum contributions, other contributions and extra-curricular items and activities for the 2023 school year.

### **POLICY**

Parent contribution, in all forms, assists our school to provide an enriched learning and teaching program for every student. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. ### Extra-curricular items and activities

Montpellier PS offers a range of activities which enhance or broaden the schooling experience and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis. As cost of camps and excursions cannot be finalised until closer to the date, these costs are based on historical costs. Families will be informed of final costs via Compass Events prior to the excursions taking place.

### BYOD iPad program 3 – 6

A 1:1 Bring Your Own Device program operates in Years 3 to 6. Parents may choose to provide an iPad for their child to use in the classroom. If parents choose not to provide an iPad, the school will make available an iPad for use in the classroom during school hours. Information will be provided to the Year 2 cohort in Term 3 2023.

### **Financial Support for Families**

Montpellier Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options. Where possible, the school will offer to assist families in the following ways: • Flexible payment plans for extra-curricular activities.

- CSEF (Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund) is available for eligible parents who hold a valid health care card or pension card. The program provides capped payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions (2022 payment was \$125). Forms are available at the office.
- Support agencies for uniforms and school curriculum materials.
