



MONTPELLIER PRIMARY SCHOOL STUDENT UNIFORM AND DRESS CODE POLICY

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Student Uniform and Dress Code Policy is to outline Montpellier Primary School's requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes.

This dress code has been developed by Montpellier Primary School's School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The wearing of school uniform has been selected to instill pride in our school, provide an identity within the community, and is fully supported by the School Council and all Staff.

The Student Uniform and Dress Code Policy aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Montpellier Primary School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.
- reduce the economic burden on families in the long term.
- gain an awareness of acceptable dress standards for specific occasions.
- ensure all students are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

The School Council has developed a compulsory dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families. While travelling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities, students are expected to comply with the following:

- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name















IMPLEMENTATION

Montpellier Primary school will ensure that this Student Uniform and Dress Code Policy is communicated to all families and students through our website and newsletter. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

Students wearing non-compliant uniform items may be asked to change into a compliant item of clothing provided by the school.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Uniform and Dress Code Policy on a recurring basis, a note will be provided to the student and parents by the classroom teacher. If non-compliance with the dress code becomes a continued occurrence, the Principal will be informed and a phone call home may be required. In this event, the school will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.

Other expectations for uniform:

- Sensible footwear must be worn - no thongs or sandals
- Students are expected to wear sporting house colour tops or Montpellier polo tops and windcheaters to sporting events
- Protective clothing to be worn during Art sessions e.g. art smock
- Parents support the wearing of school uniform and clearly mark each item with the owner's name
- Educate and encourage children to be responsible for their own clothing
- School provides a 'Lost Property' space for students and parents to freely access
- Leggings and bike shorts can be worn for layering under school dresses only
- Hair should be neat and tidy and long hair (shoulder length or longer) is to be tied up in a style appropriate for school. Such measures restrict the spread of lice or nits
- Coloured hair gel and coloured streaks in hair are not permitted
- Hair accessories are to be kept to a minimum (preferably green and white)
- Visible temporary tattoos are not permitted

JEWELLERY AND COSMETICS

Students are not permitted to wear decorative jewellery to school. Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, and watches, are the only acceptable jewellery. Students will be discouraged from wearing other jewellery items, as these are considered unsafe on play equipment and during sporting activities. Cosmetics may not be worn at school. Only clear nail polish is permitted.

HAIR AND SUN SAFETY

Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of lice and for student safety.

Jewellery, nails, hair accessories and similar items that interfere with students' ability to engage with school activities safely and fully are not permitted.

Students who wear braids or locs may wear them loose, except for applied technology classes where hair should be tied back for safety purposes.

School uniform hats must be worn outside Term 1 and until the end of April in Term 2 and then during August in Term 3 and the whole of Term 4 and on any other day prescribed by the school. School uniform hats may also be worn outside of this time period, by parent or student choice.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wrap-around that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

Parents can apply for a membership card at no cost to receive 5% discount on all uniform items. Beleza also offer Australian made uniform garments.

Should parents prefer to purchase a plain polo shirt or windcheater in the school colours elsewhere, iron on school logos, complete with instructions, are available from the school office at a cost of \$3 each.

SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES EXPERIENCING DIFFICULTY

EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE

We acknowledge that there might be instances where the enforcement of this dress code could impact students differently.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular financial hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.
- Sensory concerns including but not limited to texture of the uniform fabric.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.
